	2	Vice President Activities Update
NUS	2a	NUS meeting took place in Glasgow 9 th -11 th April. There were healthy debates throughout, however there was toxic behaviour from some. NUS affiliation may be discussed in the future. CC went to see what reforms had been completed, some were good, others not so much. The NUS liberation trans officer position is now back in place and a breakdown on voting should shortly be coming out.
Tour	2b	The Tour to Croatia is taking place on the 13 th – 19 th April, with just under 180 students participating.
Kit Tender	2c	Thanks were given to those that took part in the kit tender process. The SU are currently waiting on the terms and conditions to be

		agreed and then the supplier will be announced.
Members	2d	Activities have 5,286 unique/ 7,016 total members to date which includes 757 volunteer committee positions (including campaigns).
Committee Positions	2e	74% of committee positions for 2019-20 have been filled. The remaining 26% will be filled at By-elections in September/October. Committee handovers are underway and training will be available to the new committee members over the summer.
Cluster Reps	2f	8 out of the 11 Cluster Rep positions have been filled.
	3	Programme Updates
Social Sport Sessions	3a	Social Sport Sessions have now ended for the academic year. A total of 6,767 attendees (123% of KPI target of 5,500), this is 1,774 more attendees compared to last year.
BUCS	3b	Lincoln are currently 70 th in BUCS league with 349.5 points. There have been 158 wins (43%), 183 losses (50%) and 27 draws (7%). Cricket fixtures are still ongoing. 5 teams have won their league: Basketball Men's 1sts, Basketball Men's 2nds, Rugby Union Men's 1sts, Squash Men's 1sts and Volleyball Men's 1sts Men's Rugby Union 1sts won their Midlands Plate final against East Anglia Men's 3rds 12-7 on the regions final day at Nottingham Trent.
Societies	3c	There are currently 99 societies (including 35 academic).
Varsity	3d	Thanks were given to everyone who assisted with Varsity. It was a huge success. 1,477 (845 Lincoln and 632 Hull) students engaged with the event on the day. 124 fixtures (including 7 friendlies) were completed across 12 venues involving 32 sports and societies. Lincoln were declared winners for the 3 rd year in a row with 337 points to 234 points. Cluster Reps were asked to submit any feedback that they had.
Societies Showcase	3e	250 students attended the Societies Showcase on 5 th April to celebrate performances from Musical Theatre, HEMA, Comedy, K-Wave, Big Band, Drama, Rock and Sing-it. History (195 points) were declared winners over Lib Dems (115 points) to win the 8 out of 10 Swans quiz round.
